The factors that influence regularly fluctuating crime levels, including the number of homicides and shootings, are many. Researchers believe the Covid-19 pandemic was a primary driver behind the rise and fall of the surge in violence nationally in those years, according to a recent report from NPR.

Continued drop

Through June 30, 14 people were killed in Buffalo. The six-month total has been lower only once since 2007 - that was in 2015, when 13 people were killed. Last year, 19 people were killed from January through June.

In May of this year, only two people were shot. That's the lowest figure for May since there were nine people shot that month in 2013.

Police Commissioner Alphonso Wright said members of his department are "building trust" in the nerals on a regular basis. 52 people shot in six months community and working hard to make the city safer.

All of this year's homicide victims, except one, have been men. The only female victim was a 17-year-old girl stabbed May 4 in a home on Commonwealth Avenue. Police and prosecutors have charged her brother with second-degree murder.


For what are known as index crimes - homicides, rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries, larcenies and motor vehicle thefts, which are reported to the FBI - Buffalo saw 5,534 of those crimes through Tuesday. That's a drop of 14% compared to the same time last year when there were 6,472 reported, according to Buffalo Police.

According to department statistics, overall property crime is down 16% year over year, including a 36% drop in vehicle thefts.
